

IMAD: Initiative for Medical Aid and Orphan Care

IMAD stands for "pillars" and is a fresh charitable endeavor launched by JDT ISLAM Orphanage and IQRAA Hospital. This initiative focuses on providing educational support for orphans and extending medical assistance to those in need. The program relies on contributions from individuals and philanthropic entities to fund its activities.

The program was started in April 2023. The charity program provides free medical treatment to patients who cannot afford the expenses. Patients who are eligible for the scheme will receive free surgeries including medicines, and investigations. IMAD



also prioritized education for orphans. 25% of seats in all educational institutions under JDT Islam are reserved for orphans adhering to the government norms. The IMAD covers a wide range of medical treatments, empowers orphans through education, and reduces financial burden of poor and needy patients.

JDT Islam and IQRAA Hospital are paragons of compassion and social responsibility. IMAD ensures healthcare and education are accessible to all. It also restores health, dignity and hope to the deserving patients and orphans.

Goal

IMAD provides financial support to the needy patients and educational support to the orphans in JDT. Our aim is to ensure that no one was denied access to life saving surgeries, treatments and education because of



financial constraints. Objectives

- To provide financial help for poor patients to make quality medical care available.
- To give free education for orphans and destitute students.
- To provide the highest level of education so that they can grow to be valued members of the society.

Health Care for the Poor

IQRAA Hospital has transformed into a hub of medical excellence, delivering accessible and high quality healthcare to underserved people and communities. IMAD's mission revolves around guaranteeing that economic limitations do not hinder individuals from receiving essential surgeries, procedures, medications, and care. IMAD charity not only saves lives but also restores dignity and hope among the poor. IMAD is the footprint of compassion towards a healthy world.

PROCESS

1. **Submitting Application for IMAD Scheme:** Patient has to submit letter from any social or religious organization/ letter of member of local self-government body and copy of Aadhaar card, Ration card, doctor's prescription and insurance card, if any, along with the application before

getting the date of surgery. Primary assessment will be conducted to check whether the patient is eligible for the help.

2. **Field Enquiry:** Medical Social Worker will conduct a detailed socio-economic assessment of each identified patient to determine their ability to pay for the required surgery through the direct field work inquiry. This includes their sources of income, surgery expenses, health insurance coverage etc.

3. **Doctor's Impression:** We gather the details of the surgery/ procedure and take the opinion of doctors to ensure the medical necessity and urgency of the same.

4. **Report Submission and Committee Meeting:** The report will be tabled before the IMAD committee and the committee will analyze the report of each patient based on the data gathered from direct field work inquiry and make a final decision. Once a patient is selected, he/ she may get full or partial support. The Social worker will inform the meeting's decision and accordingly they will be able to get the surgery date. The committee meeting will be held on Fridays.

5. **IMAD Contribution:** Patients can get admission with the approval of the social work department. IMAD will pay their approved amount at the time of discharge.

EDUCATIONATIONAL SUPPORT FOR ORPHANS

Education is not only a fundamental right but also a powerful tool for breaking the cycle of poverty. Unfortunately, orphans face numerous barriers that disrupt their access to education. Understanding the financial hardships faced by orphans and destitute children and their caretakers, JDT Islam works for the welfare, care, and upliftment of orphans and destitute children. IMAD prioritizes education for orphans, and 95 students are studying under IMAD in different institutions on the JDT campus and these students are from the 25% seats set aside for orphans. The program relies on contributions from individuals and philanthropic entities to fund its activities.

JDT has decided to reserve 25% of seats in its educational institutions to orphans sticking to government norms. The financial scheme not only eases the financial constraints but also promotes inclusion and empowers orphans to live a dignified life. IMAD ensures that orphans receive quality education that nurtures their talents and equips them with essential skills for a brighter future.

The IMAD charity at Iqraa Hospital has a significant impact on the lives of individuals from low- income backgrounds who require surgical interventions. Through the initiative IMAD have been able to provide financial assistance to numerous patients. IMAD has supported 445 patients in their treatments. Our efforts have resulted in improved health outcomes and increased access to the medical care.

The IMAD Charity at JDT Islam has a significant impact on the lives of orphans. JDT Islam provides seats in all educational institutions under JDT. 95 students joined this academic year in JDT institutions under the IMAD charity. These 95 candidates are orphans in every sense and apart from this JDT itself has already been giving completely free or partially free help to the orphan candidates.

Impact

1. **Access to Surgeries:** Through the financial support provided by IMAD charity, individuals who would have otherwise been unable to afford the necessary surgical procedures now have access to them. This improves their health outcomes and quality of life.

2. **Alleviation of Financial Burden:** The financial assistance provided by IMAD charity relieves the financial burden on the patients and their families. This allows them to focus on their recovery without the added stress of medical expenses.

3. **IMAD Scholarship for education:** IMAD has provided scholarships for orphans and the destitute in all educational institutions under JDT Islam. 95 orphan students got admission this academic year.

4. **Strengthened Community Support:** The project has fostered a sense of community support and engagement, with individuals and

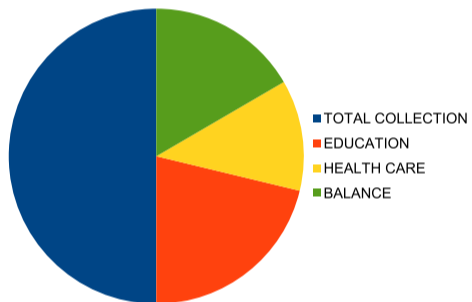
FUND RAISING

Elevate the voice of Patients for patient safety



“ELEVATE THE VOICE OF PATIENTS!”

Scenario:

A patient named 'X', 56 years old female, newly diagnosed for cerebrovascular accident. She was advised for medications and follow up after 2 weeks and could contact the Doctor for any emergency. For easy identification of medication and taking medications on time, she took the medications out of the strip and stored them in a medicine organizer. One day, she felt dizzy while getting up suddenly from bed. She contacted her consultant through the phone and presented her complaints. Consultant recommended not to change position rapidly, which may cause orthostatic hypertension and to hold the anti-hypertensive medication for one dose. As the medication was out of the strip. She could not identify the actual medication.

In this scenario, the patient was not educated regarding proper storage of medication. Patient was not aware that the medications are not supposed to be stored out of the strip, which may result in difficulty identifying medications. This incident could have been prevented if the

physician had notified the patient to the drug information centre for proper education regarding medications. Such incidents can be prevented by educating and involving patients and patient parties in patient care.

World Patient Safety Day 2023 will be observed on 17 September under the theme "Engaging patients for patient safety", in recognition of the crucial role patients, families and caregivers play in the safety of health care.

Evidence shows that when patients are treated as partners in their care, significant gains are made in safety, patient satisfaction and health outcomes. By becoming active members of the health care team, patients can contribute to the safety of their care and that of the health care system as a whole.

Through the slogan "Elevate the voice of patients!", WHO calls on all stakeholders to take necessary action to ensure that patients are involved in policy formulation, are represented in governance structures, are engaged in co-designing safety strategies, and are active partners in their own care. This can only be achieved by providing platforms and opportunities

for diverse patients, families, and communities to raise their voice, concerns, expectations and preferences to advance safety, patient centeredness, trustworthiness, and equity.

Objectives of World Patient Safety Day 2023

1. Raise global awareness of the need for active engagement of patients and their families and caregivers in all settings and at all levels of health care to improve patient safety.
2. Engage policy-makers, health care leaders, health and care workers, patients' organizations, civil society and other stakeholders in efforts to engage patients and families in the policies and practices for safe health care.
3. Empower patients and families to be actively involved in their own health care and in the improvement of safety of health care.
4. Advocate urgent action on patient and family engagement, aligned with the Global Patient Safety Action Plan 2021-2030, to be taken by all partners.
